REGIONAL CONTEST INFORMATION

Categories

Applicants create projects that adhere to the rules in the NHD Rule Book and fit one of the following categories:

Paper Documentary Exhibit Performance Website

Students may work individually or in groups of up to five (except for the **Paper** category, which only allows for **individual** projects, no groups).

Project Application & Fees

To enter the NHD Regional Contest, students - with the help of a teacher - must submit the online **Project Application**, including **all written materials** and the \$10-per-student **application fee** by:

Wednesday, January 15, 2025

The Project Application deadline is **firm**. This is to ensure we have enough time and volunteers to provide an excellent NHD experience for participants. Applicants are encouraged to start the application process early. **Teachers must create** an account before students can begin their application.

Visit www.georgiacenter.uga.edu/nhd to begin the application process. The Project Application deadline is firm, but payments may be allowed a grace period; please let us know if your payment will arrive after Jan. 15.

Paper and Website Category Entries:

Papers and Websites must be completed by January 15 and submitted with the online Project Application.

Depending on application volume, Paper and Website projects may be pre-screened, with a limited number of competitors in these categories being selected to compete at the Northeast Georgia Regional Contest. Applicants will be notified of their acceptance status.

Theme

All NHD projects must relate to the current year's theme, chosen for broad application to world, national, or state history and its relevance to ancient history or to the more recent past.

The 2025 NHD theme is **Rights & Responsibilities** in **History**.

Students are encouraged to explore this year's theme and ways to incorporate it into their project ideas at nhd.org/en/contest/theme.

- Process Paper
- Annotated Bibliography
